#### *Artist in Residence - School Driven*

1. Gather a team of teachers, administrators and parents to help you plan, write, and implement the grant.
2. Discuss school/academic goals and the needs of your students.
3. [Read the Artist in Residence Guidelines](#)
4. Browse the ND Council on the Arts - [Teaching Artist Roster](#) to select an artist that matches your goals.
5. Contact the artist to discuss availability and fees. Keep in mind that NDCA will provide funds for ½ of the total artist fee. (This includes travel, per diem, lodging, artist fee, and supplies directly related to the project.)
6. Seek additional sources for funding.



Seeking ways to develop literacy and meet the needs of students with diverse learning styles? Join us for a three-day introductory workshop and explore the dynamic relationship between art and writing.

During this three-day workshop, Beth Olshansky, Director of the Center for the Advancement of Art-Based Literacy at University of New Hampshire, will guide participants through a carefully designed progression of art-and-literature based writing mini-lessons demonstrating the connections between visual and written language. Teachers will learn how to create simple crayon resist paintings that will be used to inspire descriptive passages, poetry, and stories. They will also learn how to access rich descriptive language as they explore key literary elements in poetry and prose.
