The Disaster Recovery Section has been guiding initiatives to restore quality of life and enhance community resiliency.

State Response and Recovery Center


- Opened 90 days
- 5,000 intakes
- 47 counties
- 3 tribal nations



Housing Rehabilitation and Citizen Retention Grant

- The State Legislature allocated \$10 million for housing rehabilitation, citizen retention
- The grant helps communities assist homeowners to rehabilitate or replace their flood-damaged homes.
- Communities are more likely to retain their residents.

North Dakota Recovery Task Force Organization



Individual Assistance and Disaster Housing Committee

- Transitioning residents into permanent residential structures
- Developing housing replacement/repair



Economic Recovery

- Implementing recovery programs, SB 2371 initiatives
- Coordinating with local, tribal groups to develop economic recovery strategies



Consumer Protection Committee

- Sustaining consumer protection measures
- Providing consumer education training



Environmental Health and Infrastructure

- Identifying green infrastructure solutions
- Repairing transportation infrastructure
- Strategizing repairs to damaged solid waste infrastructure
