TESTIMONY BEFORE THE SENATE HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE

REGARDING HOUSE BILL 1465

MARCH 9, 2005

Chairman Lee, members of the committee, I am David Zentner, Director of Medical

Services for the Department of Human Services. I appear before you to provide

information regarding this proposed legislation.

This bill directs the Department to develop a plan to implement the provisions of

the Part D Medicare Prescription Drug program. As of January 1, 2006, all dual

eligible Medicaid recipients will have their prescription drugs paid by the

Medicare program. States will be required to pay a 90% clawback to the federal

government based on the 2003 drug cost for this group inflated forward to the

2006 calendar year. Currently, the Medicaid Program pays drug coverage for

these individuals.

The bill also authorizes the Department to use the services of a consultant to

assist in the development of the plan and permits us to bypass the normal state

procurement process for contract services. It also provides guidance regarding

payment of drugs for dual eligible recipients after Part D is implemented.

It also requires the Department to report on the progress of implementing

Medicare Part D.

The bill provides for a \$100,000 appropriation of which \$50,000 is general funds to

be used in the current biennium to contract for a consultant to assist in the

implementation of this new program.
