## House Bill 1477 – Department of Human Services House Human Services Committee Representative Robin Weisz, Chairman January 26, 2009

Chairman Weisz, members of the Human Services Committee, I am Curtis Volesky, Director of Eligibility for the Department of Human Services. I am here in support of House Bill 1477.

The current asset limit for Medicaid eligibility is set at \$3,000 for a single household and \$6,000 for a two-member household. In addition, each eligible individual may have a pre-need funeral account of up to \$5,000. A recipient could designate any part of the \$3,000 asset allowance to also be used for funeral expenses. All earnings from the pre-need funeral accounts are not counted toward the asset limit. The current limit has been in effect since July 2005, at which time it was increased from \$3,000 to \$5,000.

During the current interim, the North Dakota Funeral Directors Association provided information to the Department that demonstrates the average cost for a funeral is \$9,314; they also requested the funeral set aside be increased to \$7,000.

The 2009-2011 Department of Human Services Executive Budget contains the funding (\$566,000 in total funds, of which \$209,297 are general funds) to increase the funeral set aside from \$5,000 to \$7,000. This funding is based on the Department's estimate of the additional costs that will be incurred because individuals will be able to set aside additional assets and, therefore, will become eligible for Medicaid earlier than under the current limits on pre-need funeral funds.

Contingent upon approval of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), this increase is expected to be effective July 1, 2009.
