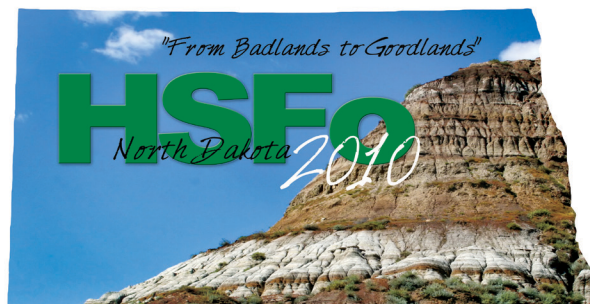

Welcome to 1875! These will be the words that greet you as you journey back into the time of Lt. Col. George Armstrong Custer and experience the legend of the American West. Fort Abraham Lincoln is where the road to the Little Big horn began! Rich in both military and early Native American history, Fort Abraham Lincoln was once an important infantry and cavalry post. It was from this fort that Lt. Col. George Armstrong Custer and the Seventh Cavalry rode out on their ill-fated expedition against the Sioux at the Little Big Horn. You will tour George and Libby's spacious mansion that overlooks the Missouri River bluffs, where you can decide for yourself if their spirits still live there! You will sense the compassionate spirit of the Mandan Indians in the six faithfully reconstructed earth lodges that can also be found at Fort Lincoln.

A complete living history encampment will be brought to life, including the firing of cannons and a Gatlin Gun by the 7th Calvary, 17th Infantry, and the 1st U.S. Artillery Regiment. The Cowboy Action Performers will bring alive the spirit of the Wild West in our own Dakota Territory. You will also experience the beauty and splendor of Native American Hoop Dancing.
