Adult Family Foster Care (AFFC) serves:

- Individuals age 18 and older with special needs or disabilities that hinder their ability to live independently

AFFC providers can:

- Decide if the needs of each person are a good match for their home
- Can provide temporary or long-term care
- Can provide care to a maximum of four residents



Benefits of being an AFFC provider:

- Receive a monthly payment for room and board and for needed care on a private pay or public pay basis
- Opportunity for stay-at-home parent to generate additional income
- Second career after retirement
- Provide stability and acceptance for residents
- Establish quality relationships with those in your care
- Provide consistency in care providers for the resident
- Access to training resources available upon request
- Will have the support of local county social services staff and other agencies to aide in meeting residents' needs

Becoming an AFFC provider:

- Need to be able to provide a private or semi-private room for each resident, three nutritional meals a day, and a safe, clean environment
- Need to meet with your local county social service agency to obtain an AFFC provider application packet
- Need to pass a criminal background check
- Need to become enrolled as a Qualified Service Provider with the ND Department of Human Services
