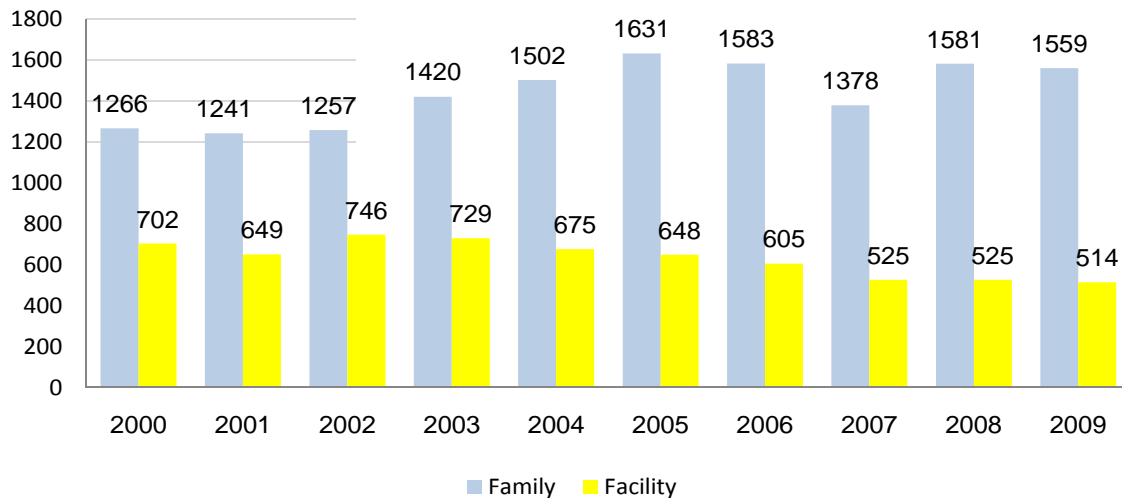

Trends in Family Foster Care and Facility Placements, FFY 2000-2009



AFCARS, FFY 2000-2009 (Unduplicated count). Family foster care includes pre-adoptive homes, relative placements, family foster homes, Professional Association of Treatment Homes placements, trial home visits, and tribal and affidavit foster home placements. Foster Care:

- The average age of foster care children in care was 10.8 years old in FFY 2009.
- 53% (1,125) of children in care had a permanency goal of reunification in FFY 2009.
- On December 31, 2009, 1,018 children were in foster care (includes tribal IV-E cases, DOCR-Division of Juvenile Services youth placed in foster care, and pre-adoptive placements). Native American children accounted for 37% (378) of this point in time foster care count.
- In December 2009, 25 foster youth were in out-of state placements (Residential Child Care Facilities-RCCF and Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities-PRTF). The number of youth in out-of-state placements decreased by 12 since February 2009 (37).
- In December 2009, there were 516 licensed family foster homes and 365 licensed therapeutic family foster homes.

Child Abuse and Neglect (FFY 2009):

- 7,714 reports of suspected child abuse and neglect were received.
- 3,828 full assessments were completed.
- To illustrate the trend in the number of full assessments: Compared to 2000 when 4,145 full assessments were completed, a decrease of 7.6% was seen in 2009 (3,828).
- A decision of "Services Required" was made in 652 (17%) of the 3,828 full assessments. These 652 assessments represent 1,241 children who were victims of child abuse and neglect and 907 caregivers who were the subjects of these assessments.

Adoptions (FFY 2009):

- There were 129 finalized adoptions (special needs, infant/regular, and international).
- 90 (70%) of the 129 finalized adoptions were special needs adoptions.
- 62 (69%) of the 90 special needs adoptions involved family foster parents.
- 29% (26) of adopted children with special needs were Native American.
- 50% (45) of adopted children with special needs were ages 1-6.

Permanency Outcomes (Point in Time data):

- 35 subsidized guardianships were in place (with 11 pending court orders) in November 2009.
- 91 children with parental rights terminated were in the custody of the Department of Human Services as of December 31, 2009.
