

Shared Vision for Services Provided within the Tompkins Rehabilitation and Correctional Center (TRCC)

Current Population

- Currently all TRCC clients are transitioning from prison.
- The typical client has a DSM-5 substance use disorder and meets the current criteria as follows:
 - Legal charges related to substance use
 - Moderate to high risk to reoffend based on LSI-R scores
 - Minimum or community custody classification
 - Medically and psychiatrically stable
 - Recommendation for ASAM level of care

Proposed Changes

- Clients with concerns related to substance use and also serious mental health conditions
- Clients who face an even more challenging transition process than the average prison resident
- Clients who are under community supervision and having difficulty meeting the expectations of their supervision term due to behavioral health concerns

Current Services

- Cognitive restructuring/Thinking for a Change groups
- Cognitive-Behavioral Interventions for Substance Abuse (CBI-SA)
- Limited provision of domestic violence intervention for men using The Duluth Model
- Re-entry case management
- Recreation, education, work

Proposed Changes

- Provide individualized assessment and recovery support plans for people who enter TRCC from the community
- Develop in-reach from Free Through Recovery providers
 - Implement care coordination model through intensive case management
- Implement medication-assisted treatment
- Emphasize emotion regulation skills
- Build import-model services for employment development and educational and leisure opportunities

Shared Vision

- Continue to provide research-supported, structured CBT interventions that addresses criminogenic risk
- Improve the provision of holistic behavioral healthcare
- Continue to improve community re-entry
- Strive for positive relationships between residents and staff to improve safety and behavioral health and criminal justice outcomes
