

Total Approved Arrivals: 276



12 heads of household are employed full-time with benefits.


6 remain enrolled in English to prepare for the workforce.




National Data – Migration Policy Institute

The integration and inclusion of refugees and immigrants into our communities is local.




Integral Community Members:

US Refugee Admissions Program

- Lautenberg Program applications for religious minorities (18,000 in queue)
- Pathway for vulnerable individuals takes 18-24 months

Uniting for Ukraine Program

 Must have US Sponsor who will take financial responsibility
