Providing Services Closer to Home

The North Dakota Department of Human Services is working to expand in-home and community-based long-term care and support services, including the Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) services.

PACE provides coordinated care for older adults living in the community who have significant support needs. Services include preventive and primary health care, and short-term and long-term care services.

On the continuum of care, individuals choose PACE when they meet nursing facility level of care, but can safely remain in their home and community with PACE services.
