## INTRODUCTION

The Counseling & Psychotherapy Center (CPC), Inc.'s Sex Offender Management and Treatment Program is made up of clinical and criminal justice professionals who have invested their careers in a victim centered response to sexual assault crimes through the entire criminal justice process. We know that most sex offenders will be released from prison or jail and return to the community. CPC is dedicated to working with victims to reduce the risk of these offenders committing another crime. Through supervision, treatment and management we work towards the goal of "No More Victims".

### RULE CPC in North Dakota

RULE CPC provides risk reducing services under a contract with the state of North Dakota. The state is investing in community safety and working towards the goal of no more victims in our communities. We provide case management and team coordination to promote enhanced management and supervision. We regularly provide written documentation regarding the Probationer/Parolee's compliance with his or her Parole/Probation conditions and treatment progress. Our containment teams, including advocates, meet regularly to discuss each client in the program and how to best protect previous victims and the community.

Advocates in the CPC program can provide you information to help you understand your rights as a victim, provide assistance in implementing these rights, and work to help maintain your safety in the community.

#### *What should you expect from RULE CPC?*

- An advocate to inform you of your rights as a victim of a crime.
- An advocate to provide support, information and resources to continue to feel safe in the community.
- An advocate to inform you if the team of professionals managing the offender fears for your safety or believe you may be in danger.
- An advocate to provide referral information, crisis services and assistance in dealing with the changes as a result of the offender's release.

### North Dakota Advocacy Centers provide:

**Victim Hotlines** – Twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, advocates are available by phone to talk to you about any concern you have. These advocates can answer questions, listen, and are there to provide support whenever you need it.

**Crisis advocacy** – Healing from sexual assault can be a life long journey. As life ebbs and flows, the experience of sexual assault can affect you in many ways. Advocates are available to help you work through the variety of ways you might respond to the sexual assault. Advocacy services are available by appointment through any of the centers listed on the back side of this brochure.

### North Dakota Fair Treatment of Victims and Witnesses

North Dakota Century Code Chapter 12-1-34

- To be informed of the investigation status
- Informed as to criminal charges being filed
- Notice of participation in court proceedings
- Notice of Pretrial Release
- Informed of services available
- Upon request, employer intercession
- Informed of victim/witness fees
- Return of property not used as evidence
- Have private waiting area away for the defendant or defendant's witnesses
- Protection of personal identifying information
- To be present during trial
- Prompt notice of disposition of the case
- Notice of hearing schedules
- To submit a victim impact statement
- Notice of final disposition and parole procedures
- Prompt notice of custodial release
- Participation in parole board and probation decisions

**Shelter** – Emergency, temporary shelter is available for victims needing to flee abusers or offenders. Please contact your local crisis center, listed on the back, to find out what is available if you need this service.

**Support Group** – Sharing your experience with others who have had similar experiences can be empowering. Knowing you are not alone, learning from each other ways to work through the various issues that may arise, and being together with people who will help you heal is all a part of participating in a sexual assault support group.
