

Out-of-State Reciprocal License

- Educator has earned a teacher education degree from an out-of-state college or university, but is missing some ND requirements. Agrees to complete requirements for full ND licensure within 2 to 4 years.

Out-of-State Highly Qualified License

- Educator has earned a teacher education degree from an out-of-state college or university. Applicant has been granted highly qualified status by their issuing state agency and has met all testing requirements.

Routes to ND Licensure For Out-of-State Educators

Interim Substitute License

- Educator has earned at least a bachelor's degree and wishes to substitute teach only.
- Must be requested by a school administrator due to a shortage of regularly licensed substitute teachers.

Initial License

- Educator has earned a teacher education degree from an out-of-state college or university. Has met all North Dakota standards and requirements regarding coursework and testing.
