BRIDGE OVERPASS STRUCK BY OVERSIZE LOAD IN KIDDER COUNTY

What: Property Damage Crash

Where: Westbound 194 / Mile Marker 197 overpass, 3 miles west of Steele

When: March 22, 2024, at 6:40 pm

Road Conditions: Good

Weather Conditions: Partly Cloudy, Clear

Crash Involvement: Vehicle/Bridge

Type of Crash: 1 Vehicle with Fixed Object-Bridge Overpass

Agencies Involved: North Dakota Highway Patrol, Kidder County Sheriff's Office, and North

Dakota Department of Transportation

Vehicle No. 1: 2019 International Semi-Truck

Driver No. 1: Seth Ponder, 29-year-old male from Denver, Colorado, no injury.

Charges: Citation for no oversize permit

Restraints: seatbelt in use

NARRATIVE: A semi-truck was traveling westbound on I-94 near mile marker 197 in Kidder County, North Dakota. The semi-truck was hauling a coil tubing reel cradle on a flatbed trailer and was approximately 17 feet high. As the semi passed under the overpass at MM 197(22nd Ave SE) the top of the coil tubing reel struck the bottom of the overpass causing extensive damage to the concrete girders and load on the trailer. Concrete debris fell onto the interstate and the truck came to a stop a short time later. North Dakota Department of Transportation was contacted to inspect the bridge which was deemed structurally sound. No injuries were reported. The overpass at this location has a vertical clearance of 15 feet 11 inches. The driver was cited for not having an oversize permit.

The North Dakota Highway Patrol would like to stress the importance of obtaining required permits for all oversized vehicles to prevent such instances in the future. It is essential to obtain permits so the oversized vehicles/loads can be routed properly to bypass any width



and height restrictions on the highways. Permits and further information about legal vehicle size and weight can be obtained at the NDHP website https://www.nd.gov/ndhp
