

INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION APPOINTS CITIZENS TO NDHFA ADVISORY BOARD

BISMARCK, N.D. – The North Dakota Industrial Commission recently appointed Ninetta Wandler, Dickinson; Lisa Rotvold, Hillsboro, and Ron Jordan, Fargo, to the North Dakota Housing Finance Agency (NDHFA) Advisory Board.

The commission also reappointed Gerald Eid, Fargo, and Mike Orness, Devils Lake, to the board.

Wandler is a broker associate for Everett Real Estate in Dickinson. She is immediate past president of the North Dakota Association of REALTORS® and is a member of the National Association of Realtors and the Badlands Board of Realtors. Wandler has worked as a real estate agent for 20 years. She will represent residential real estate sales.
