North Dakota Mill Achieves ISO 22000 Certification

Bismarck – The North Dakota Industrial Commission has congratulated the management and staff of the North Dakota Mill on receiving ISO 22000 and ISO 9001 Management System Certificates by SRI Quality System Registrar.

“These certificates confirm the North Dakota Mill’s ongoing efforts to improve efficiency and provide high quality products and services for our customers,” said Gov. Jack Dalrymple, Attorney General Wayne Stenehjem and Agriculture Commissioner Doug Goehring in a joint statement.

The three state officials comprise the Industrial Commission, which oversees the North Dakota Mill.

“ISO 22000 and ISO 9001 certification provides evidence to customers, suppliers, employees, and their community of their commitment to food quality and safety,” said A. Joseph Falcsik, SRI’s vice president for certification. “We are pleased to acknowledge that the North Dakota Mill has demonstrated effective implementation of a management system.”

SRI issues quality, environmental, health and safety, and security management system registration certificates based on internationally recognized standards. SRI is accredited by the ANSI-ASQ National Accreditation Board.

“ISO 22000 and ISO 9001 certification verifies effective implementation of documentation and records management, establishment of clear policy and practice, effective food quality and safety control and a commitment to continual improvement” said Vance Taylor, president and general manager of the mill. “ISO certification would not have been possible without the dedicated efforts of all North Dakota Mill employees.”
