

Outdoor Heritage Fund Grant Application

The purpose of the North Dakota Outdoor Heritage Fund is to provide funding to state agencies, tribal governments, political subdivisions, and nonprofit organizations to:

Directive A. Provide access to private and public lands for sportsmen, including projects that create fish and wildlife habitat and provide access for sportsmen;

Directive B. Improve, maintain, and restore water quality, soil conditions, plant diversity, animal systems and to support other practices of stewardship to enhance farming and ranching;

Directive C. Develop, enhance, conserve, and restore wildlife and fish habitat on private and public lands; and

Directive D. Conserve natural areas for recreation through the establishment and development of parks and other recreation areas.

Exemptions

Outdoor Heritage Fund grants may not be used to finance the following:

- C. Any activity that would interfere, disrupt, or prevent activities associated with surface coal mining operations; sand, gravel, or scoria extraction activities; oil and gas operations; or other energy facility or infrastructure development;
- D. The acquisition of land or to encumber any land for a term longer than twenty years; or
- E. Projects outside this state or projects that are beyond the scope of defined activities that fulfill the purposes of Chapter 54-17.8 of the North Dakota Century Code.

Boat launch areas are overcrowded and recreational need exceeds available public access. A boat launch and day use area at the south side of Schatz Point would reduce this issue. This is located at Lake Tschida, Elgin North Dakota.

- It is expected to greatly reduce the overcrowding at established boat launch area.
 - The existing boat launch on the north side of Schatz Point is often over crowded.
 - Recreation users have been using private boat launch areas.
- It is expected to deter recreational users from creating lake access from camping areas.
 - Recreational users will continue to create boat launch areas off camping sites if this issue is not addressed.
 - Expected increase in recreational use because of private developments.
- This project is expected to take two weeks to complete.
 - In cooperation with the Bureau of Reclamation, Lake Staff, volunteers and contractors.
- This project will become a permanent public use area, maintained by Lake Staff.
 - Once established, this area will be used by the public.
 - Ongoing maintenance will be done by Lake Tschida Recreation staff.

The Tri-Cities Joint Job Development Authority has a management agreement with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation to develop, manage, operate and maintain the recreation areas and facilities at Heart Butte Reservoir, also known as Lake Tschida. The Tri-Cities Joint JDA is organized by a cooperative agreement between the towns of Elgin, Carson and New Leipzig, all located in Grant County, North Dakota.

Lake Tschida has a staff of 7. One fulltime recreational manager, two fulltime seasonal office personnel, three full time seasonal maintenance and three part time seasonal maintenance. Prairie Learning center, Lion’s Club, and community members volunteer for a wide range of duties.

The project goal is the construction of a boat launch and day use area on the south side of Lake Tschida in the Schatz Point area.

In 2012 Lake Tschida had over 50,000 visitors; this boat launch will provide additional access to the 3400 acres of water available to the public.

The concept is to build this boat launch and day area utilizing the natural contours of the area as much as possible.

This will be a single lane boat launch with a boat dock, truck and trailer parking and a day use picnic shelter with table and stand up grill.

The boat launch will follow an established dirt road in that area. Natural drainage will be retained by planting trees and bushes specific to the area that were recommended by the North Dakota Forest Service. These trees and bushes will provide an attractant to wildlife. For erosion control and fish habitat a vegetated riprap on the shoreline will be used.

The south side of Schatz Point has over 50 multi-unit camp site areas, a private home addition and 33 permit units. Many of these recreational users routinely go to the boat launch at a private group use area of Elgin Lion's Club when the available public boat launch area is crowded.

The minimal urgency of this new 2014 spring project is to prevent recreational users from creating additional boat launch areas off camp spots to compensate for overcrowded or hard to access launches.

The project will have the deadline scheduled at the yearly spring meeting in early 2014, at that time, the Bureau of Reclamation, Recreational Manager, and Maintenance Supervisor will schedule this project within the spring startup of the recreational season.

The two Tri-Cities Joint JDA lake supervisors: Mark Stelter and Wayne Nagel have supervised multiple lake projects and will keep it on schedule.

The Lake Tschida Recreation Manager: Steven Schadler has over 20 years with park and recreational departments. He has supervised all projects at Lake Tschida for the last three years and will oversee and assist in this project.

The Lake Tschida Office Manager: Will be contacting contractors and will do any other scheduling needs.

The Lake Tschida Maintenance Staff will be assisting as needed.

The Bureau of Reclamation will provide any additional planning assistance (if needed), the NEPA study, earth moving equipment and people to assist with labor.

Staff and the Bureau will continue to monitor and document the traffic counting machines weekly during the recreation season.


