Outdoor Heritage Fund Grant Application



The purpose of the North Dakota Outdoor Heritage Fund is to provide funding to state agencies, tribal governments, political subdivisions, and nonprofit organizations to:

Directive A. Provide access to private and public lands for sportsmen, including projects that create fish and wildlife habitat and provide access for sportsmen;

Dead Colt Creek the only County Park in Ransom County. It has a manmade lake with great recreational activities and fishing. The Park has 45 RV hookups and numerous primitive camping spots and tenting spots. During the summer camping months it is full of weekend and monthly campers. It is also a popular park for surrounding communities to bring their children to play at for the afternoon or to go camping in the summer. We are looking at installing a playground system that would be for children ages 2-12 and also a basketball court the size of 20X30 for any age group. The project would be completed in the spring of 2015. The total project would cost \$60232.00. We will be applying for local cost share from and the Garrison Diversion. The playground equipment would be installed by the parks four softball diamonds, which is located in the middle of the East and West camping areas so they could be utilized by all recreational activities. The ball diamonds get used extensively throughout the summer hosting different ball tournaments and regular games. We hope you see the needs for recreational playground equipment for Dead Colt Creek Park.

(no more than 300 words) The Dead Colt Creek Dam Project has been a goal of the Ransom County Water Board since the first public meeting was held on March 8, 1977. In late 1982, the State Water Commission’s Engineering Division started preparing final plans and specifications for the construction of the dam.

Construction operations began May 18, 1983 with final inspection of the project on July 10, 1984.

The recreational facility consisted of the preparation of the beach area and installation of a fishing pier and two precast concrete boat ramps; several comfort stations and picnic shelters; roadway preparation and graveling and construction of one maintenance shop building and other associated playground equipment.

Since the original construction several shelter belts and tree plantings have been incorporated into the park. Four softball fields were added to the complex along with some smaller playground equipment. The fishery was stocked with trout and later pan fish and other species.

In 1988 we paved the boat dock ramp so it would help with the erosion of the steep ramp. Continuous work has been done on the parking lots and the infrastructure.

In 1995 the pavilion was added which is being used for many family reunions, wedding receptions, class reunions, etc. Camping became a major part of the park with West and East end camping. Later we added bath houses to each end of the complex. The roads were blacktopped and most recently chipped and sealed. In 2013 we added a visitor center and office.

The Ransom County Water Resource District Board oversees Dead Colt Creek. There are three Board Members that are appointed by the County Commissioners. The Dead Colt Creek employs one park manager and two part time park employees. There are several organizations that volunteer to do work out at Dead Colt including local Boy Scouts and 4-H clubs.

The goal of the project is to provide playground equipment for the park visitors. We would like to see more families take the opportunity to visit the park and increase outdoor activities. Dead Coit Creek gets used extensively throughout the summer months but we are hoping this would draw more families to the park. Strategies of this project would increase park usage and the benefits would be to provide quality safe play equipment for all users. The project would be completed in the spring of 2015. Without the funding we would not be able to provide adequate playground equipment for a park this size. As being the only County Park in Ransom County we strive to make it a great park where people would want to bring their families. Without the funding we would be unable to provide playground equipment for the campers and park visitors.

The Ransom County Water Resource District consists of three Board members. They oversee the Park Superintendent who would be in charge of the project. The park superintendent has years of experience in managing the park and has taken numerous classes in park management. He will be working closely with the contractors and monitoring the project to make sure it is completed in a timely fashion.

We can measure the success through camping attendance. There is no daily admission for the park but it would be a great benefit for the campers and general public. We will also be able to observe the playground use during ball games and tournaments.

POLICY STATEMENT**

The Matching Recreation Grant Program

The Garrison Diversion Conservancy District Board of Directors instituted a matching recreation grant program and established that funds for the grant program will consist of two tenths of the mill levy Garrison Diversion receives.

Grants may be requested for new recreation facilities, enhancement, expansion or market planning of existing facilities.

Eligibility

Political subdivisions located within the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District may apply for a matching grant, including park boards, water resource districts and county or city commissioners. Community groups, service clubs and non-profit organizations are not eligible to apply for funding.

Multiple-county sponsored projects located within Garrison Diversion boundaries may be eligible for up to 50% of the non-federal share, and **single-county sponsored projects** may be eligible to receive up to 25% of the non-federal share. To be considered for a 50% non-federal cost share, more than one county must contribute funds to the project.

Scope of Projects

Eligible projects may encompass a variety of components which provide actual, or are a complement to, natural resource outdoor recreational opportunities. Projects may include, but are not limited to boat ramps and docks; picnic facilities; sanitary facilities; campgrounds; beach and bathhouses; playground areas; and bicycle, pedestrian, cross-country ski or horse trails.

Application Procedure

The Recreation Committee meets biannually to consider grant applications. A completed application form and required documentation must be postmarked by April 1 or September 1 to be considered at the next meeting.

The application must include, but not be limited to 1) audience intended to be served, 2) estimated project costs, including future operations and maintenance, 3) predicted source of all funding, 4) plans for new construction, and 5) documentation of support for, or objections to, the proposal.

Guidelines for All Applicants

Applications need to include a list of all funding sources applied for and amounts received.

All projects must have long-term managing partners with operation and maintenance funds available for the life of the project.

Applicants requesting \$5,000 or more are encouraged to attend the Recreation Committee meeting to present the project and answer questions from the committee.

Eligible Project Costs

Site planning costs, including engineering costs, may be included as eligible project costs.

Only construction costs incurred after the date of grant approval by Garrison Diversion will be eligible for reimbursement.

Money to be credited as the local sponsor's share of the project may be raised in a number of ways and may consist of actual dollars or in-kind donations of labor, materials and equipment costs.

Non-Eligible Projects

The following are types of projects or elements of projects that are **not qualified to receive recreation funding**:

- 1) Any type of maintenance for a facility or structure or equipment used for maintenance.
- 2) Development, enhancement or maintenance of roads to or within facilities.
- 3) Water lines, sewer lines and electrical services to facilities other than immediate hookups.
- 4) Projects on private property without a public interest to the land.
- 5) Projects on school property.
- 6) Shore stabilization including riprap.
- 7) Any project that does not meet current ADA standards.
- 8) Land acquisition costs will not be considered eligible for reimbursement, and the valuation of land may not be credited toward the local sponsor's match.
- 9) Projects that do not allow for reasonable access by the public.
- 10) Swimming pools and any type of ball-field or ball-court projects..

Requirements for All Approved Grants

Projects which receive approval must submit appropriate engineering data and/or a site plan for approval before construction begins, along with a legal description of the facility and its location.

Following completion of the project and verification of expenditures on the local sponsor's part, reimbursement will be made by Garrison Diversion. Partial payments may be made at the discretion of Garrison Diversion. Projects receiving grants over \$5,000 may receive a sign paid for by the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District thanking major sponsors of the project.

Recreation projects that receive a grant need to report to the Recreation Committee within three years in order to retain any unused funds, or the funds will be returned to Garrison Diversion's recreation grant pool.
