Project Name: Doyle Memorial Park Swimming Area Project

Executive Summary:

Project Doyle Memorial Park Swimming Area is to build a swimming area with a sandy beach that would be accessible to the public. Doyle Memorial Park is a popular destination for fishing, boating and camping. For this new project we would like to provide an area for swimming that would be entertaining and safe for all ages.

Our camping season begins Memorial Day weekend and the projected goal is to have this project done by that time in 2015. This project will be an improved addition to Doyle Memorial Park. The new attraction will bring in fees from more visitors and campers. This will help with expenses to maintain this project and other maintenance costs for the park.

Narrative: The Wishek Park District was established in 1948 by the citizens and taxpayers of the city of Wishek. The city of Wishek was founded in 1898 and its citizens have from that point in time, recognized the value of "public" picnic, swimming and recreation areas. During the early years, the shores of Green Lake served as a picnic area and a quiet place to spend an afternoon for local residents.

Located on Green Lake, Doyle Memorial is leased by the city of Wishek and the Wishek Park District. The area is popular for camping, fishing and boating. This recreation area, established in 1925, occupies a peninsula jutting into Green Lake in the rolling farmland of south central North Dakota.

The recreation area is named after J.J. Doyle, who gave the original acreage. Doyle came to the area in 1884 with his father who homesteaded nine miles south of Wishek. He served on the first village board when Wishek was established in 1898, and later served in the North Dakota House of Representatives in 1909 and 1915.

Although Doyle Memorial is one of the state's smaller recreation areas, it offers great opportunities for outdoor recreation with picnic shelters, modern campsites, boat ramp, fishing dock and playground.

In 1990 the Wishek Park District established control and management of Doyle Memorial Park. It is our mission to continue to provide the public access to the recreational area and continue to improve the facility. The addition of a new swimming area at Doyle Memorial would be a very nice asset to the area and for everyone to enjoy for years to come.

The Wishek Park District was organized in 1948 and continues to manage and maintain Doyle Memorial Park, the city park, recreation area and campground, the swimming pool and Lloyd E. Rigler golf course. Our board consists of five elected officials. The Park District would like to continue to make capital improvements to all these recreational facilities including project Doyle Memorial.

In 1990 twenty acres of recreational property was added to the Park District's staffing and management. Doyle Memorial park was dropped by the State Parks system and a lease agreement was signed which brought the property under control of the Park District. The District continues to manage and maintain the beautiful recreational and camping area, which is located on Green Lake southeast of Wishek.

Purpose of Grant-to help us with funds for a swimming area.

Management of Project- A project committee has been established, with members of the Park District and the Wishek Wildlife Club. This committee will manage and oversee the project with help from James Loken, Manager at Beaver Lake State Park, who has been involved in a project similar to this in the past. The project should not take longer then three weeks. Everyone on the committee is very excited about the swim area to take place. Everyone on the committee enjoys camping and going to Doyle Memorial for the day/weekend. The committee members are all very dedicated and very eager to get things done the right way.

Evaluation: We will be able to tell if the project is successful by the number of people who will enjoy the swim area at the lake during the summer.





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

Mary – I have had a chance to look over your application and have a couple of questions.

- 1) You refer to matching funds but didn't indicate how much of this project would be paid from matching funds. You show the total cost of the project as \$25,633.75 and then are requesting that the Outdoor Heritage Fund pay for all the costs. Are there additional costs that should be identified as part of the project and that those additional costs will be provided by the Wishek Park Board and Wishek Wildlife Club? You state as the source of matching funds as the "money in our general checking accounts" so that would be a cash match. If there are some in-kind contributions from individuals helping with the project, that can also be identified as matching funds.
