Surplus Insight

As I sat at my booth in the corner of the Conference Room at the Seven Seas hotel in Mandan, ND, I heard the vague murmurs of the forum going on in the adjoining room for those in attendance at the North Dakota County Weed Board Association's 28th Annual Meeting. I took a sip of coffee and began to write about the conversation I had with two attendees the previous day.

As we stood at the Surplus Property booth, the two attendees thumbed through the copies of the Surplus Property Monthly newsletter while we exchanged conversation about property listed in the newsletters and the Featured Donee articles they contain. Amidst my excitement upon learning that customers are reading and enjoying the Featured Donee articles, I felt it was important to share with them why the articles are valuable to Surplus Property.

North Dakota State Agency for Surplus Property (Surplus Property) belongs to a larger organization called the National Association of State Agencies for Surplus Property (NASASP). NASASP produces a quarterly publication called the Federal Surplus Newsletter that informs all member states, states that manage a federal surplus property donation program, about changes in the program at the national level.

In the Spring of 2011, the cover story for the Federal Surplus Newsletter, written by NASASP President, Curtis Howard (IL), encouraged member states to provide stories and pictures about successful donations of overseas property. Marilyn Trachsel, NASASP Treasurer, was collecting the information to publish in future newsletters so that members of congress could learn about the valuable service the federal donation program provides to local governments in member states.

As Howard stated in his article, "Our Associate Membership Program is at historic highs; Congressional support and assistance continues to field more interest and support for strengthening the Federal Surplus Donation program; and, expansion of the Donation program rather than contraction appears to be a favorable trend for NASASP as is evident by President

Obama's signing the Veteran's Act of 2010 into law." The FOR VETS law allows Veteran's organizations to participate in the donation program and receive federal surplus.

To help keep the momentum going for the federal surplus donation program, North Dakota Surplus Property added a Featured Donee segment to our monthly newsletter in January 2011. We have been fortunate to have had nine volunteers participate in the Featured Donee segment and we would like to maintain it in our newsletter, but we need you to help us.

If your school has an art classroom full of wardrobes and bookshelves to store art supplies and students' masterpieces, let us know! If your county is using a bulldozer purchased from Surplus Property to remove snow from roads and parking lots, let us know! If your Boy Scout troop is going on an outdoor excursion and you are packing sleeping bags, tents, mess kits and lanterns purchased from Surplus Property, let us know! Regardless of the size or price tag of any purchase your government entity has made at Surplus Property, let us know because it will only encourage the maintenance and growth of the federal surplus donation program.
