In conjunction with the GreenND program, Surplus Property would like to provide schools with the computer equipment they need by implementing our ExchangeND program. The program is designed to help agencies dispose of their e-waste in a safe, responsible and economical manner by accepting the following property free of charge: CPUs, laptops, keyboards, mice, flat panel monitors, cell phones and accessories. Computers and accessories that can be reutilized, are sold to schools at minimal cost.

Every year, Surplus Property sells an estimated 1,500 computers to schools for use in classrooms and labs. Help improve the environmental and educational future of North Dakota by participating in the ExchangeND program.

What is GreenND?

GreenND is an electronic waste (e-waste) recycling program administered by Surplus Property. All North Dakota government agencies are eligible to utilize this program to recycle their e-waste in a safe, responsible and cost effective manner.

Who is eligible to use GreenND?

- State agencies
- Cities
- Counties
- Schools
- Health, education and elderly care nonprofits

How does GreenND work?

Surplus Property collects, palletizes and stores unsalable e-waste at our warehouse in Bismarck. When we have accumulated enough unsalable e-waste to fill a 53-foot semi-trailer, it is picked up by our contracted recycler. The e-waste is then brought to a certified recycling center that follows a strict no-landfill policy.

North Dakota government agencies must call and schedule an appointment with Surplus' E-waste Specialist ahead of time to drop off their e-waste. Agencies will be billed accordingly based on the GreenND Fee Schedule.

When can e-waste be dropped off?

To schedule an appointment to drop off your agency's e-waste, please call 701/328.9665 and ask to speak with our E-waste Specialist.

*E-waste drop off times are limited to Mondays and Tuesdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. by appointment only. Additional charges may be assessed to organizations who drop off their e-waste outside of normal drop off times.

*All e-waste must be delivered to Surplus Property.

How is my information secured?

Unsalable electronics containing hard drives will be sent to the certified recycling center where they will be cleaned in accordance with the Department of Defense (DoD) high-level security wiping procedures.

Computer hard drives must be wiped prior to being sent to Surplus Property so that they can be reutilized by schools and other eligible organizations. For more information about computer reutilization, read about our ExchangeND program on the back panel.

Surplus Property is not responsible for wiping or destroying the hard drives of property they receive.

GreenND Fee Schedule

Category	Description	Fee
Free	Any age, any condition laptops, CPUs, keyboards, mice, flat panel monitors, cell phones and accessories.	No charge
Small	Equipment 40 lbs. or less. Includes small (CRT) monitors, office phones, handheld radios, small desk printers, etc.	\$5
Medium	Equipment 41-150 lbs. Includes large (CRT) monitors, tabletop printers, copiers, radio equipment, plotters, televisions, etc.	\$10
Large	Equipment 151 lbs. and over. Includes free standing copiers, mailing equipment, large plotters, big screen televisions, etc.	\$30
Large Volume	Extremely large equipment, partial and full-truckload shipments of electronic waste.	Negotiated based on state contract rates, location and volume
Hazardous Materials	Any material determined to be hazardous materials. Includes chemicals, liquids, ballasts, fluorescent bulbs, etc.	Actual disposal costs
