

ORDINANCE NO. 4224

**AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING PROPERTY TO THE CITY
OF MINOT AND EXTENDING THE BOUNDARY OF THE
CITY OF MINOT.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MINOT:

Section 1. The city limits of the City of Minot are hereby extended to include as a part of the property contained within the corporate limits of the City of Minot, the following described property:

Outlot 10 of the NW1/4SW1/4, Section 22-155-82, less Lots A and B.

Section 2. This property is currently zoned Heavy Industrial District. Any development of this property shall be in accordance with the provisions as set forth in the City of Minot Zoning Ordinance.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.


