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High School Students can be eligible for Chapter 35 benefits!

Eligibility

- Dependent of a veteran who has a 100% service connected disability or died from any cause while 100% service connected.
- Dependent of a veteran who has 100% individual unemployability rating from the VA.
- Dependent of a veteran who died on active duty.
- Dependent of a veteran who is missing in action, captured in the line of duty, being held by a hostile force, or being forcibly detained by a foreign government or power.

At what age am I eligible to receive benefits?

Dependents must be 18 years of age attending high school and be a son, daughter, stepchild or adopted child of the veteran.

What do I get?

Eligible dependents receive up to 36 months of benefits. A monthly stipend is paid to the student not to exceed \$1,041. Note: this is the maximum amount under this program, actual payments may be different

Eligible persons will receive benefits from the month that they turn 18 to the time that they graduate high school. This time will be deducted from the total 36 months of eligibility.



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Our Agency wants to assist you with accessing the benefits that you are entitled to. We will assist you and your high School in navigating the process.

Talk to your Guidance Counselors

If you think that you may be eligible for Chapter 35 benefits, also called Dependents Educational Assistance, please consider reaching out to your school guidance counselors to talk about the program. Talking to them should be the first step you take in finding out if you qualify.

You may also call our agency at 701-298-4667 to ask questions about your eligibility. We will do the best we can to answer your questions in a timely manner.

Your parent(s) will also need to be involved in the process if you chose to utilize this benefit.
