GRANT FUNDING OVERVIEW TO TRIBES

A total of **\$944,621.96** is currently in contract with tribal nations (*July 2019 – August 2020*).

NON-GRANT FUNDING

Free Through Recovery

- 26% of participants are enrolled tribal members

SUD Voucher

- 14.7% (568) of individuals receiving services self-identified as enrolled tribal members
- \$6,820.95 reimbursed to Good Road Recovery (MHA) through Oct 2019.

STATE OPIOID RESPONSE (SOR) GRANT

- **Eligibility:** Available to all tribes
- **Goal:** address the opioid crisis by increasing access to medication-assisted treatment, reducing unmet treatment need, and reducing opioid overdose related deaths through the provision of prevention, treatment and recovery activities for opioid use disorder

- **Current efforts:**

Three Affiliated Tribes

- increase access to intake, assessment, and treatment
- purchase necessary equipment and provide tele-behavioral health to individuals with an OUD.

**Turtle Mountain Band
Of Chippewa**

- provide outreach and engagement efforts
- address barriers to treatment for individuals with an OUD

Spirit Lake Nation

- provide outreach and engagement efforts
- address barriers to treatment for individuals with an OUD
- educate tribal members about MAT
- provide support and education at tribal schools

PARTNERSHIP FOR SUCCESS (PFS) GRANT

- **Eligibility:** Available to communities/tribes identified as high need (based on data-driven formula)
- **Goal:** Prevent underage drinking among persons aged 12-20
- **Current efforts:**

Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa

- Server Training
- Unruly gatherings tribal code
- Alcohol restrictions at community events

Spirit Lake Nation

- Teen party ordinance/loud party
- Social host liability
- Appropriate penalties/strengthen the prosecution, adjudication and sanctioning of alcohol laws
- Texting tipline
- Youth alternative events

SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT BLOCK GRANT

Eligibility: Available to all tribes

Goal: Address gaps related to substance use disorder treatment and recovery

Current Efforts: Three Affiliated Tribes – MHA Nation

- Parshall Resource Center
 - 9 bed residential treatment
 - Licensed Addiction Counselor

SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT BLOCK GRANT

- **Eligibility:** Available to each tribe
- **Goal:** Prevent substance misuse and related consequences based by following the Strategic Prevention Framework.

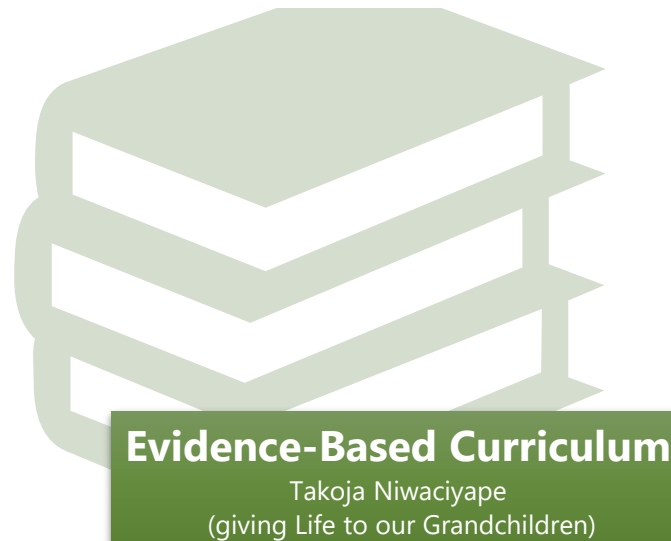
