WHEREAS, the North Dakota Commissioner of Financial Institutions (hereinafter "Commissioner") takes notice that Amy Bradly was an employee of the former Citizens Community Credit Union, a credit union chartered by the North Dakota Department of Financial Institutions until placed into conservatorship and subsequently merged into First Community Credit Union, also a state chartered credit union.

WHEREAS, the Commissioner has reason to believe that while employed at Citizens Community Credit Union and, following the merger, as an employee of First Community Credit Union, from August of 2004 to October of 2018, Amy Bradly committed acts of commission, or omission, or practice which is a breach of trust or a breach of fiduciary duty.

WHEREAS, Amy Bradly has pled guilty of Theft of Property, a Class A felony, Misappropriation of Entrusted Property, a Class A felony, and Theft of Property, a class B felony.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Amy Bradly be immediately suspended and not eligible to be employed or otherwise participate in the affairs of any financial corporation, financial institution, credit union, or any other entity licensed by the North Dakota Department of Financial Institutions while this Order is in effect, pursuant to North Dakota Century Code 6-01-04.1(5)

If you wish to contest this Order, a hearing must be requested in writing within 20 business days of the date the Order is served pursuant to North Dakota Century Code Chapter 28-32. This Order is permanent upon failure to request a hearing within the above time frame.
