ND Health Enterprise MMIS Key Points

- The new ND Health Enterprise MMIS platform is scheduled to go live October 5th, 2015
- New system is now referred to as ND Health Enterprise MMIS
- Current system will be referred to as ND Legacy MMIS

ICD-9 Changing to ICD-10 Effective 10/1/15

- The International Classification of Diseases (ICD) is used to standardize codes for medical conditions, diagnoses, and institutional procedures.
- The U.S. has been using ICD-9-CM for more than 35 years.
- The current code set, ICD-9, was created in 1979 and contains outdated, obsolete terms that are inconsistent with current medical practice as it cannot accurately describe the present-day diagnoses and inpatient standards of care.

ICD-10 Code Set Brings Added Value

- The ICD-10 code sets have updated medical terminology, including classification of diseases and procedures for comparison of morbidity diagnosis and mortality data.
- The new code sets also provide better data for measuring care provided to patients, tracking health conditions, making clinical decisions, identifying fraud and abuse, designing payment systems and processing claims.
- In general, ICD-10 coding expands the level of detail and specificity for many medical conditions. The new system includes combination diagnosis/symptom codes to reduce the number of codes needed to fully describe certain conditions, and allow for the reporting of laterality (“right” and “left”).

ICD-10 Claim Submission/ SA Instructions

- Compliance Date for ICD-10 implementation is October 1, 2015.
- ICD-9 Codes will no longer be accepted for Dates of Service on or after 10/1/2015.
- Claims containing ICD-9 codes for Dates of Service on or after 10/1/2015 will be denied
- Claims with Dates of Service prior to 10/1/2015 must have an ICD-9 code.
- Claims with Dates of Service that span October 1, 2015 must be split into separate claims.
- ICD-9 and ICD-10 codes cannot be billed on the same claim – these claims will be denied.
