Governor's Committee on Aging to Meet Dec. 13 in Bismarck

BISMARCK, N.D. – The Governor's Committee on Aging will meet Fri., Dec. 13, 2013, in Bismarck to discuss issues impacting older adults and the services and programs that help them. The meeting is from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Edgewood Vista, 3124 Colorado Lane. The meeting is open to the public.

Agenda items include updates on the Vulnerable Adult Protective Services Program, Guardianship Establishment Program, mandatory reporting of abuse and neglect of vulnerable individuals, and housing-related efforts from the N.D. Housing Finance Agency. Committee members will discuss the committee's budget, membership and role of the committee, and work plan for 2014. There will also be a recap of the Governor's Committee on Aging Forums held this year and discussion on regional forums for 2014.
