State Council on Developmental Disabilities to meet March 10

BISMARCK, N.D. – The North Dakota State Council on Developmental Disabilities will meet Thursday, March 10, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Central Time, at multiple video conference sites across the state to discuss changing the 2016 state grant funding cycle, council goals and objectives, and the timeline for State Plan activities.

The council will also receive committee reports and will meet in executive session to review the small grant requests it previously received, along with the initial Executive Committee scoring on those grant requests.
