Informational meetings for direct care workers to be held in Bottineau and Minot on April 20

BISMARCK, N.D. – The North Dakota Department of Human Services' Medical Services Division will hold informational meetings in Bottineau and Minot, N.D., for current qualified service providers and anyone interested in being an in-home caregiver for older adults and people with disabilities.

Qualified service providers are friends, neighbors, family members, and others who provide in-home care to older adults and people with disabilities so they can continue to live in their own homes and communities.

Individuals from Bottineau and Ward counties are invited to participate in these meetings.

- **Bottineau**, 2 to 4 p.m., Bottineau County Courthouse, 314 Fifth St. W., Commissioner's Conference Room

Meeting participants will learn how to complete provider enrollment forms and billing documents, and will learn about programs and services available through the department that support independent living. A department representative will also review qualified service provider rates and reimbursement requirements and will share information about how to become a qualified service provider, as well as the responsibilities associated with being a caregiver.

There are currently about 50 qualified service providers in Bottineau County and about 130 qualified service providers in Ward County.

"There is always a need for qualified services providers, especially in rural communities," said Karen Tescher, assistant director of the department's Long-Term Care Continuum services.
