Developmental disabilities council to meet Aug. 23 to review its budget and funding support for grants promoting inclusion and other priorities

BISMARCK, N.D. – The State Council on Developmental Disabilities is meeting Thursday, Aug. 23 in Bismarck to review its operating budget and funding support for grants. Members will also hear a report from the Bismarck Public Schools on the Inclusive Sports project, which the council helped fund, and will conduct other business when they meet from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the Brynhild Haugland Room of the Capitol.

Standing committees will provide updates on their activities, and council Executive Director Julie Horntvedt will report on upcoming conferences, training opportunities and partnerships supporting self-advocacy.
