ND Brain Injury Advisory Council to meet May 21

BISMARCK, N.D. – The council that advises the North Dakota Department of Human Services about services and supports for people with brain injuries and their families will meet Friday, May 21, from 1 to 4 p.m. Central Time. The meeting is open to the public.

The meeting agenda includes discussion on eligibility criteria for the Medicaid 1915(i) home and community-based behavioral health services, the 2021 legislative session and upcoming interim activities, and realignment of membership slots and roles based on Senate Bill 2039.

Council members will also review the state's application for a Traumatic Brain Injury State Partnership Grant offered through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Community Living.

The council has reserved time for public comment on brain injury services at 3:45 p.m. Other business will be discussed.
