Annual Synar Report 2012

The purpose of the Synar Survey is to randomly survey licensed tobacco retailers across North Dakota to check compliance with laws that prohibit the sale of tobacco products to minors. ***This is not an enforcement activity***; it is a check on compliance.

2012 Synar Results

The Synar Survey has been conducted for the past 16 years. All 50 states and nine jurisdictions (American Samoa, District of Columbia, Guam, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Northern Mariana Islands, Puerto Rico, Palau, and the Virgin Islands) currently participate.

The Synar amendment requires that states maintain a noncompliance rate at or below 20 percent, or they could lose up to 40 percent of the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment block grant funding. North Dakota receives approximately \$5.5 million annually in block grant funding.

Since Federal Fiscal Year 2006, all 50 states plus the District of Columbia have been in compliance with the Synar amendment.
