NOTICE OF INTENT TO CREATE
ADMINISTRATIVE RULES RELATING TO
N.D.A.C. CHAPTER 75-09.1-11
SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER TREATMENT VOUCHER SYSTEM

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Department of Human Services will hold a public hearing to address proposed creation of N.D. Admin. Code chapter 75-09.1-11 at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, December 21, 2015, in Bismarck, N.D. in Room 210, located on the second floor of the Judicial Wing of the State Capitol.

The proposed creation of N.D. Admin. Code chapter 75-09.1-11, Substance Use Disorder Treatment Voucher System, is necessary to comply with an appropriation measure passed during the sixty-fourth Legislative Assembly in 2015 Senate Bill 2048.

The proposed changes are as follows:

Chapter 75-09.1-11 is created to to establish the definitions; the application process for a program, including approval and denial of an application, provider review process, and agreement; the revocation process; the voucher payment denial process; the services qualifying for and reimbursed by the voucher system; the individual eligibility requirements, including approval, denial, and appeal process; the reimbursement process; and the requirements for process measures and outcomes measures reports and training for the substance use disorder treatment voucher system.

The proposed amendments are anticipated to have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000. No taking of real property is involved in this rulemaking action.
