- \$6,820.95 reimbursed to Good Road Recovery (MHA) through Oct 2019.

## **STATE OPIOID RESPONSE (SOR) GRANT**

- Eligibility: Available to all tribes
- Goal: address the opioid crisis by increasing access to medication-assisted treatment, reducing unmet treatment need, and reducing opioid overdose related deaths through the provision of prevention, treatment and recovery activities for opioid use disorder
- Current efforts:
