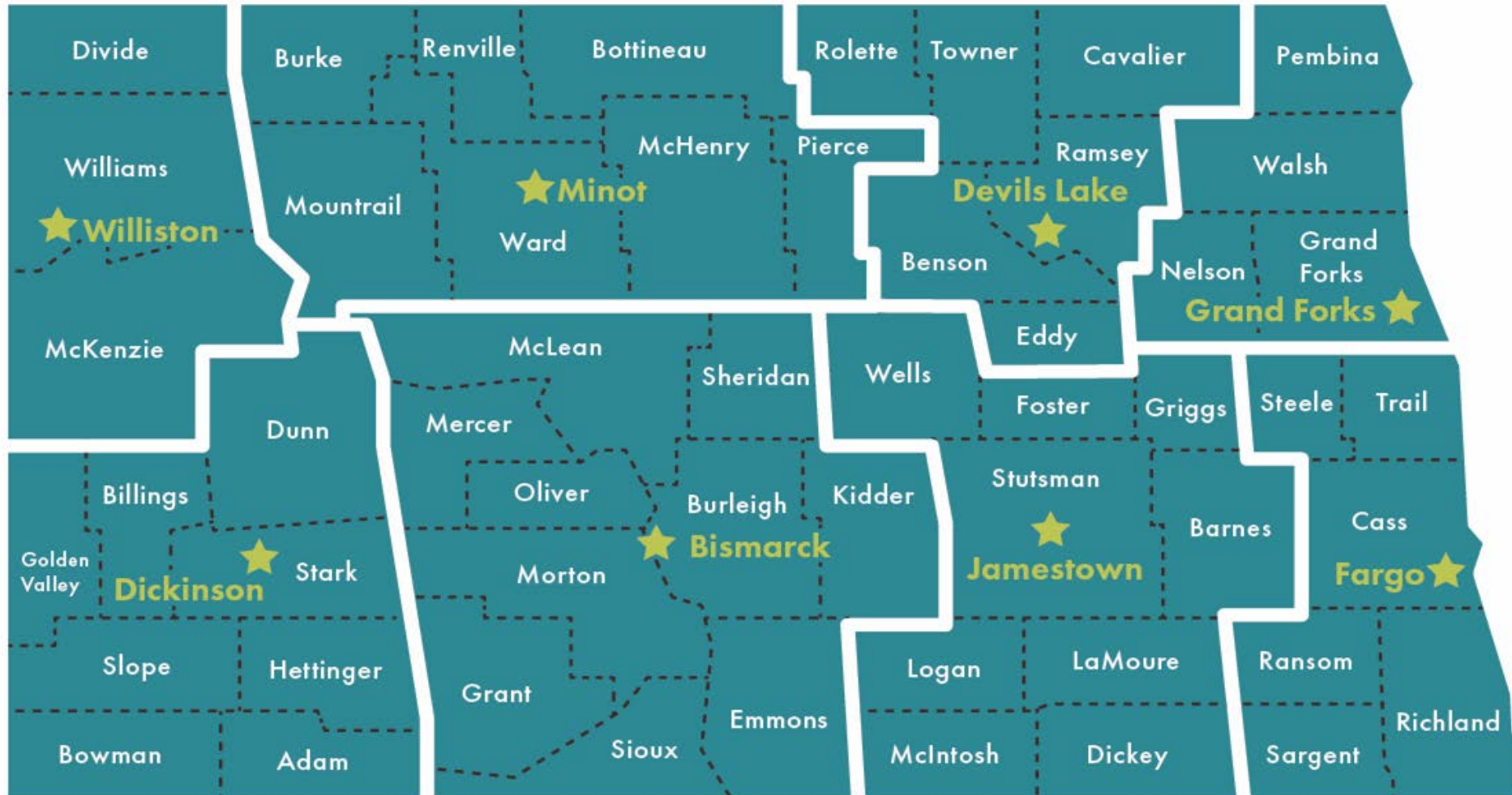

8 clinics, 3 satellites, 14 outreach offices, mobile response, and 1 state hospital



Meet Sue



Sue is a 25-year-old woman who graduated from high school, with honors, and attended a local university. In her sophomore year of college, she stopped attending classes and was eventually expelled.

Sue was hearing voices that said mean things to her and seeing things other people don't see. She started using alcohol and other substances to keep the voices away. She lost her job and apartment. She lost her will to shower, work, or be a part of community.

After starting services our doctor helped her choose medicine that took the voices away. However, the medicine didn't help her get a job, a home, or enjoy all the things she used to. This inability to initiate and persist in goal-directed activity is a negative symptom of severe mental illness.

Sue needs a team to help her restore her health, home, job, and community.

- Mental health technicians

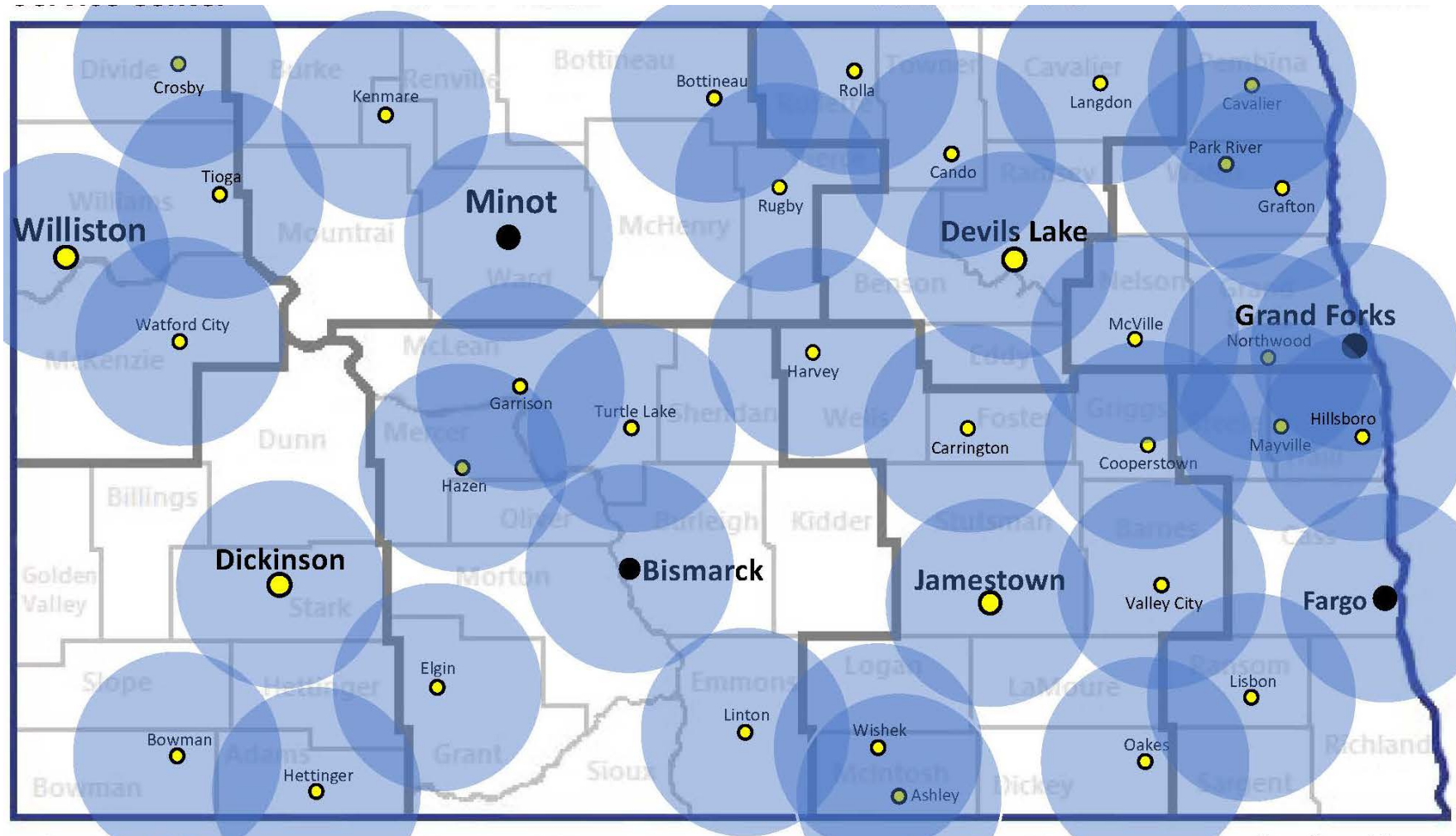

NORTH DAKOTA STATE HOSPITAL

GEROPSYCHIATRIC NURSING CARE PARTNERSHIP

- NDSH procures and trains private nursing homes
- Medicaid funds specialized geropsychiatric rate
- NDSH serves as admissions gatekeeper
- NDSH serves as primary psychiatric hospital



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
