CHILD SUPPORT Program Purpose

The purpose of the Child Support program is to help parents meet the needs of their children by securing appropriate and sustainable child support.



CHILD SUPPORT What we do – Full Service and Limited Service

- Customer service
- Establishment of paternity
- Establishment of a child support and medical support order
- Income withholding
- Other enforcement actions such as tax refund offset and license suspension
- Employment services
- Periodic review and modification of child support obligation
- Payment processing



CHILD SUPPORT Opening a Full-Service case

- TANF Referral
- Medicaid Referral
- Foster Care Referral
- Referral from another state or tribal or international child support program
- Application by a parent



CHILD SUPPORT Return on Investment

Every \$1.00 spent on Child Support generated \$6.58 for family recipients







1 in 3 ND kids

In 2020, 65,999 children received child support services. That is more than 1 of every 3 children under age 18 in the state.

1 in 5 North Dakotans

149,720 people received child support services in North Dakota in 2020.

1 in 7 ND adults

In 2020, 83,721 parents received child support services. That means 1 of every 7 adults (age 18+) in the state has a connection to the child support division.

Meet Bobbi Jo & Tanner




Bobbie Jo is 22 years old and lives in Devils Lake. She used to live with the father of her two-year old son Tanner.

Tanner's father acknowledged his paternity in the hospital when Tanner was born but broke up with Bobbie Jo when Tanner was a baby.

Bobbie Jo has a part-time job at a local convenience store. She is receiving health coverage for herself and Tanner under the Medicaid program.

She is struggling to make ends meet, but currently makes too much income to be eligible for SNAP or TANF.



\$25 million


More than \$25 million in child support per year is not received in the month when it is due

\$250 million

More than \$250 million is owed in past-due support in full-service cases and nearly \$400 million total in all cases

COLLECTIONS - WHERE THE MONEY GOES

Child support agencies work collaboratively, across state lines, to ensure that families receive the child support they are owed regardless of where they live.



HOW WE MEASURE SUCCESS Establishing Paternity

If needed, Child Support will help with establishing paternity for the child, using the in-hospital paternity acknowledgment program and court actions.



HOW WE MEASURE SUCCESS Collection of payments owed

When child support is received, the child is able to grow up in a more secure and stable environment.


Studies have shown that for every \$1 a family receives in child support, \$0.19 is saved in reduced need for TANF, SNAP, Medicaid and other programs.






OVERVIEW OF BUDGET CHANGES (IN MILLIONS)


