# **Thrifty Food Plan**

The monthly <u>allotment</u> is equal to the <u>Thrifty Food Plan</u> for the household's size reduced by 30 percent of the net monthly income. The Thrifty Food Plan is based on 100% of the federal poverty level. Minimum SNAP Allotment is \$23 \$24.

#### **Standard Deduction**

Standard deduction based on counting <u>eligible</u> <u>household</u> members in determining household size is as follows:

<u>Ineligible</u> or disqualified household members are not used to determine the household size for purposes of the standard deduction.
