

HOUSE BILL NO. 1175

SECTION 18. CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT TASK FORCE.

The department of human services shall convene a child support enforcement task force to study the interaction of the business community and the child support enforcement program.

The task force must include two members of the legislative assembly appointed by the chairman of the legislative council. The department shall extend invitations to representatives from the

- Financial,
- Insurance,
- Employers,
- Public utilities, and
- Other business interests.

The study must include strategies for

- Encouraging voluntary participation in electronic data matches,
- The feasibility and desirability of mandatory data matches or mandatory electronic transfer of information,
- The identification of potential sources of income and asset information regarding child support obligors,
- The creation of a lien registry for property owned by a delinquent child support obligor, and
- The development of procedures for conducting data matches that are
 - secure and
 - limited to the information needed to assist in the establishment and enforcement of
 - child support and
 - medical support orders.

The department of human services shall present the findings and recommendations of the task force, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-second legislative assembly.
