In addition to the requirements listed above, students must have one unit of computer science or cybersecurity, unless the student has completed a computer science and cybersecurity integration plan approved by the local school board.

*Physical Science may be waived if the student has both a full credit of Chemistry and a full Credit of Physics. Students pursuing this route would meet the 3-unit science requirements with a full credit of Biology, a full credit of Chemistry, and a full credit of Physics.
