# High- Quality Instructional Materials Grant Q & A





## Who is eligible?

- All North Dakota public school districts serving elementary buildings
- This funding is good for K-5/6 instructional materials aligned to the Science of Reading
- Districts having received the Systemwide Literacy Improvement grants (NDSLI) are not eligible
- High poverty districts having received the Comprehensive Literacy State Development grants (NDCLSD) may be eligible if funding is available



# How to Apply

- Fill out the application linked
- Print out and have your superintendent and elementary principal sign the form, attach to application

#### High-Quality Instructional Materials Grant


Through ESSER III funding, the NDDPI is offering an opportunity for public school districts to apply for a grant between \$10,000 and \$50,000 to aid in purchasing high-quality instructional materials (HQIM) aligned to the science of Reading from an approved list.

The application window is November 27-December 20, 2023.

### How the funds can be used

- 90% 100% of awarded funds on HQIM (line 600) all must be from the approved list found linked on HQIM webpage
  - Core reading HQIM
  - Supplemental HQIM
  - Intervention HQIM
- 0 10% of awarded funds on Implementation and Process
  - Travel for curriculum fair (500)
    - Offerings can be found on the SEEC website
  - Stipends for instructional material review team (100)
  - Implementation support & training (300)



## Priorities for Reviewing Applications

- The goal of this grant is to help districts who are engaging in the SOR work bring aligned instructional materials into their classrooms
- Core instructional materials is the first priority
- Supplemental/ intervention materials for schools who already have aligned core in place is second
