

## ND Specialist Trained in Dyslexia Credential Coursework Guidance

This guidance assists with the interpretation of the following North Dakota Administrative Codes:

### **NDAC 67-11-25-04. Requirements for a specialist trained in dyslexia credential.**

1. To obtain a credential for a specialist trained in dyslexia to teach students in a school setting, an educator must hold a valid North Dakota educator's professional license issued by the Education Standards and Practices Board.
2. The individual must have completed the required coursework from a state-approved institution of higher education. This coursework must include all of the following:
  - a. Introduction to dyslexia.
  - b. Assessment for students with dyslexia.
  - c. Interventions for students with dyslexia.
  - d. A minimum of three semester hours of practicum experience related to dyslexia assessment and interventions.
3. An individual is exempted from subsection two if the individual has completed certification approved by the International Dyslexia Association (IDA) or the Center for Effective Reading Instruction (CERI). The certification must include a practicum experience of a minimum of three credits or forty-five clock hours and be equivalent to that required in subsection 2.

### **NDAC 67-11-25-05. Application process.**

1. The application process to obtain a credential under this chapter must consist of:
  - a. The completion of an online application; and
  - b. The submission of official transcripts and other documentation as needed.
2. The law allows for two avenues to obtain a credential.
  - a. An educator may take courses from an approved state institution.
  - b. An educator may present certification through the [International Dyslexia Association Center for Reading Instruction](#) (IDA-CERI).

Below are three suggested approaches to coursework for obtaining the ND Specialist Trained in Dyslexia Credential.
