


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2024, the average score of fourth-grade students in North Dakota was 241. This was higher than the average score of 237 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in North Dakota in 2024 (241) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (240) and was higher than their average score in 2000 (230).
- The percentage of students in North Dakota who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 43 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (40 percent) and was greater than that in 2000 (25 percent).
- The percentage of students in North Dakota who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 81 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (81 percent) and was greater than that in 2000 (73 percent).

COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS



In 2024, the average score in North Dakota (241) was

- lower than those in 2 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 25 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 24 states/jurisdictions



SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Black students in 2000, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2000, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2024, male students in North Dakota had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 21 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2000 (17 points).
