

# 21st CCLC Activity Selection Quick Reference Guide

*Use this guide to determine the correct activity category when entering attendance data.*

## ESEA Activity Category & Purpose

## When to Select

### Academic Enrichment – Accelerated Learning

- **Purpose: Challenge high-achieving students and promote academic excellence.**

Activities designed to advance students beyond grade-level expectations (e.g., advanced math, AP prep, gifted programs).

### Academic Enrichment – Mentoring Programs

- **Purpose: Foster positive role models and guidance.**

Structured mentoring relationships for academic/social growth (e.g., pairing students with adult mentors or peer mentors).

### Academic Enrichment – Remedial Education or Tutoring Services

- **Purpose: Address learning gaps and improve proficiency.**

Activities focused on helping students meet grade-level standards (e.g., homework help, targeted tutoring in reading/math).

### Activities for English Learners

- **Help English learners achieve academic success and language proficiency.**

Language acquisition support (e.g., ESL classes, bilingual tutoring, vocabulary development).

### Assistance to Students who have been Truant, Suspended, or Expelled

- **Purpose: Reduce dropout risk and improve school connection.**

Activities aimed at re-engagement and behavioral support (e.g., attendance recovery, counseling, restorative practices).

### Career Competencies and Career Readiness

- **Purpose: Build workforce skills and career awareness.**

Activities preparing students for post-secondary success (e.g., job shadowing, resume workshops, career fairs).

### Cultural Programs

- **Purpose: Foster inclusivity and global understanding.**

Activities promoting cultural awareness and diversity (e.g., multicultural events, heritage celebrations, arts programs).

### Drug and Violence Prevention and Counseling

- **Purpose: Support safe and healthy environments.**

Activities addressing substance abuse, bullying, and violence prevention (e.g., counseling sessions, prevention workshops).

### Expanded Library Services

- **Promote literacy and access to educational resources through library programs, reading clubs, and digital literacy initiatives.**

Activities that involve library access, reading clubs, digital literacy programs.

### Healthy and Active Lifestyle

- **Encourage physical health and wellness through fitness activities, nutrition education, and programs that support lifelong healthy habits.**

Activities that involve physical fitness, nutrition education, wellness activities.

### Literacy Education

- **Improve reading and writing skills for students and families through interventions, workshops, and literacy-focused events.**

Reading interventions, writing workshops, family literacy nights.

**Financial Literacy**

- Equip students with essential money management skills, including budgeting, saving, and understanding financial systems.

Activities that involve budgeting, saving, money management lessons.

**Parenting Skills and Family Literacy**

- Strengthen family engagement and support parents in fostering literacy and educational success at home.

Parent workshops, family engagement activities.

**Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics including Computer Science**

- Build critical thinking and problem-solving skills through hands-on STEM activities, coding, robotics, and science experiments.

Activities that involve robotics, coding, science experiments, etc.

**Services for Individuals with Disabilities**

- Ensure equitable access to programs through adaptive activities, specialized support, and inclusive practices for students with disabilities.

Adaptive programs, special education support.

**Telecommunications and Technology Education**

- Develop digital literacy and technology skills, including safe internet use, tech-based learning, and virtual collaboration.

Activities that involve digital skills, online safety, tech-based learning.

**Well-Rounded Education Activities**

- Support academic success and graduation through credit recovery courses, enrichment programs, and activities that broaden educational experiences.

Activities focused on credit recovery courses or enrichment supporting graduation.

**Always choose the category that reflects the primary purpose of the activity, not secondary benefits. Consider where the most substantial instructional time is focused to help you choose the most appropriate category. Activities must be entered in 30-minute increments.**
