

Q&A for LEAs on North Dakota's GYO Programs

- Q) What programs are offered for paraprofessionals who want to become North Dakota licensed teachers?
- A) Currently, there are two programs to support paras to get their teaching license:
 - Registered Apprenticeship Program in Teaching (RAP-T), which is funded by the State Apprenticeship Expansion Formula Grant from the US Department of Labor.
 - North Dakota's Para-to-Teacher Program (PTP), previously called SB 2032, was adopted in the 2023 ND Legislative Session.

Must paras be paid during student teaching portion of their training?	No	Yes
