## Title I Credential Renewal Requirements

## Renewal Title I Reading Credential Elementary, Title I Math Credential Elementary, Title I Math Credential Secondary, Secondary Generalist Credential:

The applicant must complete four semester hours of graduate-level credit before the expiration date of the applicant's credential.

1. The credits must be in reading and/or mathematics, depending on the credential being renewed;
2. The credits must consist of two each in reading and mathematics if the applicant is renewing both a mathematics and reading credential: and
3. The credits must consist of education content-related courses if the credential being renewed is a secondary generalist Title I teacher credential.

An applicant who holds a two-year educator's professional license must complete two semester hours of graduate-level credit before the expiration date of the applicant's credential.

1. The credits must be in reading and/or mathematics, depending on the credential being renewed;
2. The credits must consist of one each in reading and mathematics if the applicant is renewing both a mathematics and reading credential; and
3. The credits must consist of education-related courses if the credential being renewed is a secondary generalist Title I teacher credential.

## Renewal Title I Coordinator Credential:

An applicant for renewal of a Title I coordinator credential who holds a valid five-year North Dakota educator's professional license or a life license shall:

1. Renew the credential prior to the expiration of the applicant's educator's professional license or every five years if the applicant has a life license;
2. Submit an online application; and
3. Participate in department-sponsored Title I-related training events as evidenced by a certificate of attendance at four or more workshops attended since the date the current credential was issued.

An applicant for renewal of a title I coordinator credential who holds a valid two-year North Dakota educator's professional license shall:

1. Renew the credential prior to the expiration of the applicant's educator's professional license;
2. Submit an online application; and
3. Participate in department-sponsored Title I-related training events as evidenced by a certificate of attendance at two or more workshops attended since the date the current credential was issued.
