Speaking Practice

- www.vocaroo.com
 - o Simple to use
 - o Ad-free
 - Record and save audio clips
- www.online-voice-recorder-com
 - o Simple to use
 - o Free, but does have some ads
 - o Record and save audio clips as MP3
 - o Can edit/shorten audio clips
- www.mote.com
 - o Chrome extension
 - Free, paid version has additional functionality
 - Voice recorder to embed audio in Google
 - Student and teacher access
 - Students can replay clips for comprehension
 - Pause & resume features (note: ACCESS speaking assessment does not allow pause and resume or multiple attempts)
 - Mote Minutes training/PD on YouTube
 - o Clips are shareable in multiple formats on various platforms
- Google Docs Voice Typing
 - Voice to text to practice clarity and fluency
 - o Translation feature can be very helpful
 - o Translation feature automatically creates a copy, leaving the original untouched

Writing Differentiation

- ClozeIt
 - Google Docs extension (add-on)
 - o Creates fill in the blank worksheets with a word bank from any text

 - Great for discussion and critical thinking, prediction, description
 - o Includes additional information on graph topics
 - o Several types of graphs, grade levels, and content area topics
- www.anton.com
 - o Website and app available for computer, iPad, phone, etc.
 - o Free and ad-free
 - High quality graphics
 - o Basic skills for language and content
 - Paid version offers ability to assign class assignments and monitor progress of individuals
 - Always adding new activities, topics, and rewards
 - o For use at school and/or home, for any age and proficiency level (families can use it too)
 - Huge variety of subjects and access to all grade levels
 - Ability to change language to help aid newcomers (6 languages available)
 - o Helps with new skills, preview, review, practice
 - Paid version allows assignment of tasks and progress monitoring

StoryWorld

- Early literacy program for K-2
- o For EL and non-EL students
- Diffit
 - o Easy to use free and paid versions
 - o Al to adapt or create reading passages
 - Summarize
 - Comprehension questions
 - Vocabulary words
 - Translatable and customizable
- Rewordify
 - Simplify text
 - Free access to many classics and free documents
 - Build vocabulary and comprehension

Translation

- Google Translate
 - Chrome extension best for websites, including LMS, allows you to set a language and choose options
 - App is best for speaking practice and includes translate hover and take a picture to translate features
 - Website has more features, best for allowing user to type, handwrite, speak, copy/paste, also allows translation of text within an image and can translate some documents and websites
- Translating image-based PDF scans can pose problems for translation software
- Google Slides must be saved as a PDF or PowerPoint prior to translating
- <u>Canva</u> has embedded translation features
- Deep L translator is the most accurate, but the free version is limited
- NYU Steinhardt Bilingual Glossaries and Cognates
 - o Reputable content-area translations
 - Multiple languages, content areas, levels
 - Create unit-specific glossaries

- QR Code Translator
 - o Make a sign speak any language
 - Build a page with your information, translate to any of 130+ languages via machine translation, download one QR code that stores up to 15 different language translations of your document.
