In-School Calibration Walks			
A Framework Specialist will facilitate small groups or pairs of administrators to apply prior learning of the observation process. Each day will consist of the following: Observing and collecting: evidence of classroom practices (10-15 minutes), Aligning and Discussing: evidence collected, to the most appropriate Components of the Framework for Teaching, Sharing: findings/decisions with colleagues and clarifying understanding of alignment to Components, and Determining: appropriate Framework rubric ratings and discussing the alignment to the levels of performance on the rubric.			✓
Calibration Assessment			
This course assesses your proficiency in three essential skills for conducting growth-focused classroom observations: collecting objective evidence, aligning evidence to the Framework for Teaching, and assessing practice using the Framework rubrics. Designed to adapt to your skill level, the course provides targeted support and supplemental training as needed, ensuring you develop confidence and accuracy in every observation.	√

Participants will examine nine core Framework components, learning how to know and value students, model mindsets for learning, and enhance learning experiences by integrating academic, social, and emotional development. Through this course, educators will gain practical strategies to foster deeper student learning and create environments where all students are engaged, challenged, and supported.		✓	✓
