Application Deadline: **November 1, February 1, May 1, and August 1 of every year**

Award: \$20,000 to \$75,000 over a one-year period

Eligible Applicants: Nonprofit charitable organizations classified as a 501(c) (3) public charity by the Internal Revenue Service, or a public school district, private/public elementary and secondary schools.

Purpose: To help meet the needs of American society in the areas of youth and scientific education. Funding Priority is on youth education, specifically in the areas of science, technology, engineering, mathematics, the environment, job training and literacy.

Eligible Applicants: See applications for details

Purpose: Funded projects will increase walking and benefits of walkability in communities, work to develop the walking movement by growing the number and diversity of people and organizations pushing for more walkability, and they should make walking safe, easy, and enjoyable for all community members.

Farm to School Grants

Application Deadline: **December 8, 2016**

Award: Various grant amounts from \$15,000-\$100,000

Eligible Applicants: Funding is available to support **school-based** programs only. Eligible schools are considered pre-K-12 school food authorities (SFAs) that participate in the National School Lunch or Breakfast Programs and/or operate USDA's Summer Food Service Program/Seamless Summer Option or Child and Adult Care Food Program on-site. Pre-K-12 non-profit private schools, charter schools, Indian tribal schools, and others that participate in the National School Lunch or Breakfast Programs, and/or operate USDA's Summer Food Service Program/Seamless Summer Option or Child and Adult Care Food Program on-site, but are not associated with an SFA, are also eligible to apply.

Purpose: To assist eligible entities, through grants and technical assistance, in implementing farm to school programs that improve access to local foods in eligible schools.

Application Deadline: **January 1, April 1, and July 1, October 1 of every year**

Award: \$39,000 is the average, although there is no specified amount

Eligible Applicants: Tax-exempt organizations (i.e., municipalities, school districts) and 501 (c)(3) organizations involved in youth baseball and/or softball.

Purpose: To promote and enhance the growth of youth participation (ages 10-16) in baseball and softball throughout the world by funding programs, fields, coaches training and uniforms, equipment and other selected program expenses.

Teacher Incentive Grants

Application Deadline: **August 1 through April 1 (during the school year)**

Award: Up to \$600.00

Eligible Applicants: The following criteria should be used as a guide for developing your proposed project: Are meaningful connections made between or among the disciplines? Is in-depth learning promoted? Are high quality examples from the art(s) and other discipline(s) used? Is appropriate terminology used? Are the artistic processes of creating, performing, and responding incorporated? Is assessment ongoing throughout the project? Is there a final evaluation of student learning? Applications MUST be received four weeks prior to the project start date. Applications will be reviewed by a panel and may take up to four weeks to process.

Purpose: Art activities, such as contests, can enhance lessons in non-arts subject areas when successfully integrated.

Award: Variable

Eligible Applicants: Good Sports has grants available to all K-12 schools that serve youth in disadvantaged areas of the country. Directly serve youth between the ages of 3-18 years old, serve youth in an economically disadvantaged area, are located in North America (U.S. and Canada), operate an organized sport, recreational activity, or fitness program that offers consistent and structured opportunity for play to large groups of children.

Purpose: To get students moving with athletic equipment, footwear and apparel.

Eligible Applicants: Schools, tribal entities, public and private entities

The initiative aims to engage, organize and mobilize people to improve the health of their communities and reverse the childhood obesity epidemic. The goal of the grant opportunities within this initiative is to make effective strategic investments in ongoing state, local and tribal public policy issue campaigns in order to increase public policy impact on healthy weight and living among children. Voices for Healthy Kids is focusing efforts on six priority areas and applicants should link their applications to these priorities.

Award: \$500; one grant is given out every week

Eligible Applicants: Applicant must be 25 or under and must be a U.S. citizen.

Purpose: These grants can be used towards project ideas and programs that are just getting started, or to jump-start your program and realize your ideas for the first time. These grants can also be used towards projects that are already developed and sustainable, towards the next steps of your project and organization to help you as you look to expand your project and grow your impact.

Purpose: Increasing access to summer meals programs supported through the Summer Food Service Program or the National School Lunch "Seamless Summer" Program; Educating and enrolling more eligible families in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and the Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) program; Increasing the availability of school breakfast through alternative models such as "in-classroom" breakfast and "grab-n-go" breakfasts; Increasing access to afterschool snack and meal programs, as well as child care programs, supported through the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP); Advocacy around any of the above anti-hunger issues.

FTPF Fruit Tree Orchard Grant

Application Deadline: **No deadline**

Award: A fruit tree orchard

Eligible Applicants: Nonprofits, public schools, or government entities that own the planting site, are committed to caring for the trees in perpetuity, have a source of irrigation nearby and can help coordinate local volunteers to help on the day of planting.

Purpose: To assist in planting fruitful trees and plants to alleviate world hunger, combat global warming, strengthen communities, and improve the surrounding air, soil, and water. FTPF programs strategically donate orchards where the harvest will best serve communities for generations, at places such as community gardens, public schools, city/state parks, low-income neighborhoods, Native American reservations, international hunger relief sites, and animal sanctuaries.
