MINUTES

Thursday, September 10, 2015

Sakakawea Room, State Capitol, Bismarck, North Dakota

The Education Standards and Practices Board (ESPB) meeting was called to order at 9:02 am by board chair, Mary Eldredge-Sandbo. Board members who attended were Kimberly Belgarde, Karen Christensen, Amy Mann, Mike McNeff, Laura Mihalick, Paul Stremick and Gary Thompson. Others who attended the meeting were Diane Weber and Janet Welk from ESPB, and Gwen Marback and Bob Christman from DPI, Sandra DePountis from the AG's Office, Lou Aronson former ESPB staff member, Patty Barrett and Greff Greenwood from ND United.

Introductions were held.

To the agenda, Philip Kimmel and Torie Post were added as board cases.

CASES

A motion was made by Gary Thompson to grant an initial, one-year sub license. Second by Laura Mihalick. Motion carried. He was formerly employed at Oberon Public School as the superintendent.

Amy Mann made the motion to approve the **August 3, 2015 minutes**. Second by Laura Mihalick. Belgarde. Motion carried. Board members who voted in favor were Kimberly Belgarde, Karen Christensen, Mary Eldredge-Sandbo, Amy Mann, Mike McNeff, Laura Mihalick, Paul Stremick and Gary Thompson. Karen Christensen then made the motion to approve the **August 10, 2015 conference call minutes**. Second by Gary Thompson. Motion carried. Board members who voted yes were Kimberly Belgarde, Karen Christensen, Mary Eldredge-Sandbo, Amy Mann, Mike McNeff, Laura Mihalick, Paul Stremick and Gary Thompson. Laura Mihalick made the motion to approve the **August 27, 2015 conference call minutes**. Second by Mike McNeff. Motion carried. Board members who voted in agreement were Kimberly Belgarde, Karen Christensen, Mary Eldredge-Sandbo, Amy Mann, Mike McNeff, Laura Mihalick, Paul Stremick and Gary Thompson.

A motion was made by Gary Thompson approving the **July/August 2015 financial and licensure reports**. Second by Laura Mihalick. Motion carried. Board members who voted in agreement were Kimberly Belgarde, Karen Christensen, Mary Eldredge-Sandbo, Amy Mann, Mike McNeff, Laura Mihalick, Paul Stremick and Gary Thompson. The July financial statement showed

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\$82,336.08 in income received, total expenses showed \$73,024.36 with a net income of \$9,311.73. The August financial statement showed \$100,299.64 in income received, \$79,867.23 in total expenses with a net income of \$20,432.41. The July 2015 licensure report showed 1089 total licenses/endorsements issued. The August licensure report showed 1,424 total licenses/endorsements issued.

A motion was made by Karen Christensen to hire Lou Aronson as the Educator Shortage Researcher on a temporary basis to gather data on where the teacher shortages are? What are other states doing? What are districts doing to recruit teachers? Common items on the shortages? Are the openings all full-time, part-time, a percentage of time? Are the openings the same as last year? How are the openings posted? Second by Gary Thompson. Motion carried. Board members who voted yes were Kimberly Belgarde, Karen Christensen, Mary Eldredge-Sandbo, Amy Mann, Mike McNeff, Laura Mihalick and Gary Thompson. Paul Stremick voted no.

The 2012 Audit Reports were distributed to the Board. The report will be voted on at the October meeting. The audit was done by Mahlum Goodhart, PC in Mandan.

Janet Welk provided a history on licensure changes within the last 11 years; showing the efforts that ESPB is taking in alleviating shortages. In 1960, with the major/minor law, emergency licenses were being issued to individuals who had not been prepared as educators. The emergency license allowed individuals to return back to school while teaching in the classroom. In 1995, the emergency license was switched to the alternate access license. Forty alternate access licenses were issued in 2000. Seventy-six alternate access licenses were issued in 2015. During 1999, the educators were allowed to apply for the life license. Prior to 2011, ESPB has been working with the profession to change the requirements for counselors, special education and ESL to allow more flexibility within the school district. At this time, the Board has dropped the special education disability designate and allowing any special education educator to work with any child with a disability. Again in 2011 North Dakota had a law change, any professional educator holding a valid/current license for a state was given a North Dakota teaching license without taking additional testing or coursework. In 2013, this law was further opened to allow for full reciprocity of any endorsement from any state. Since 2011, 2,044 Other State Educator Licenses have been issued. In 2014 all content areas were deemed critical shortage areas, including physical education and elementary education. This now allows alternate access licenses to be issued in all areas. Beginning in 2014-15, the Board allowed Praxis testing for any educator, who has held a license for at least two years, to move up/down to teach in a new content area. ESPB has assisted 148 educators who have completed the process and have added the new content area to their license. All these changes have been done without an increase in licensure fees. The last fee increase was in 2011. Various surveys have shown educator license fees are still lower than other professional license fees.

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At the September meeting, no content expert applications had been received. A motion was made by Kimberly Belgarde for clarification/wording changes to be done by Janet Welk and Sandy DePountis for administrators to understand. Second by Laura Mihalick. Motion carried. Board members who voted yes were Kimberly Belgarde, Karen Christensen, Mary Eldredge-Sandbo, Amy Mann, Mike McNeff, Laura Mihalick, Paul Stremick and Gary Thompson.

A community expert committee has been formed to develop a rubric/application/questionnaire. The committee consisted of Gary Thompson, Paul Stremick and Karen Christensen.

Sandy DePountis provided a colored, flow chart on the two options on how a license becomes a board case.

Janet Welk summarized the emergency rules process for the Board. At the current time, the community expert emergency ruling has been submitted to the Administrative Rules Committee. The content community expert was granted by Governor Dalrymple on August 28, 2015.

Janet Welk provided an overview of the different license types that ESPB issues.

Mary Eldredge-Sandbo asked for a committee to be to develop model for North Dakota Educators Code of Ethics. The committee will consist of Laura Mihalick, Mike McNeff, Amy Mann and Mary Eldredge-Sandbo.
