Meeting Minutes – Occupational Licensure Advisory Committee Department of Labor and Human Rights January 4, 2024, 10:00 a.m., Microsoft Teams

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m.

Committee members discussed background checks as being a deterrent to the goal of licensing out-ofstate applicants within three days and possible solutions to speed up the process, such as recommending that the Legislature appropriate funds to Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) to hire more employees. Commissioner Svihovec said he planned to meet with BCI to discuss the issue.

Members also briefly discussed how boards track the speed of the application process.

Commissioner Svihovic broached the idea of formulating a short questionnaire for associations and unions to get their views on their boards' licensure process for out-of-state applicants and continuing education requirements, in lieu of attempting to reach out to individual licensees. This way associations and unions will have an opportunity to make their views known for this study. Members agreed that the proposed questionnaire should seek to reflect where the associations and unions believe their members are at with respect to those issues.

Mr. Hardy joined the meeting at 10:27 a.m.

After concluding discussion about the associations and unions questionnaire, members spoke about the response rate for the licensing boards' questionnaire; Governor Burgum's goal for this study to result in actionable solutions for the Legislature to implement next year; and universal licensure.
