PROGRAM DESCRIPTION AND GUIDELINES

The North Dakota Department of Agriculture is pleased to announce that cost share funding is available for land enhancement and habitat renewal projects on non-federal lands in North Dakota. The cost share funding will be available at a 50% reimbursement rate with the exception of plant food, which will be reimbursed up to 25%. Funds will be used to enhance lands and habitat that have been negatively impacted by noxious and invasive species, overland flooding, erosion, drought, habitat loss, etc. Control of noxious weeds must be a component of all proposed projects.

The funding, acquired through the US Forest Service, will be used to cost-share project expenses in negatively impacted areas with 10% forest cover or impacted areas adjacent to or associated with wooded vegetation.

Proposed projects should display cooperative efforts by private and public landowners/managers and county weed boards.

Priority will be given to projects that:

- Work cooperatively and across boundaries with state, federal and private landowners
- Enhance educational opportunities for landowners and land managers regarding Best Management Practices (BPMs)
- Implement EDRR practices to prevent, control and eradicate noxious and invasive weeds
- Restore habitat for wildlife
- Prevent noxious and invasive weed establishment in impacted areas and stop the spread of new and existing populations
- Require GPS mapping
- Utilize an IPM approach (which includes mechanical, chemical, cultural and biological means) where possible
- Mitigate future land problems

Activities, including but not limited to the following, may be components of proposed projects:

- Collaborate with interested parties regarding project activities
- Educate landowners and land managers regarding Best Management Practices (BPMs)
- Prevent noxious and invasive weed establishment in impacted areas
- Monitor impacted areas to assess management needs over time
- Survey for noxious and invasive weeds as part of an early detection and rapid response program
- Map project sites, noxious and invasive weed locations and treatment and biocontrol sites

- Treat/eliminate noxious and invasive weed infestations through chemical, mechanical, cultural and biological means using an IPM approach
- Introduce APHIS approved biological control agents (when approved and available)
- Monitor weed infestations and associated biocontrol agents
- Prepare impacted areas for final use
- Revegetate impacted areas to native or beneficial species

COST- SHARE PERCENTAGES, STANDARDS AND REIMBURSEMENT REQUIREMENTS

The intention of this cost share funding opportunity is to offset some of the costs related to land enhancement and habitat renewal projects.

- Requests for reimbursement must be made in writing. Subgrantees agree to reimbursement of expenses, provided all financial documentation is submitted.
- Only approved activities completed during the contract period will be cost shared.
- Project areas must include at least 10% forest cover or be adjacent to or associated with wooded vegetation.
- Weed control must be a component of all projects.
- Maps of project areas are required.
- Cost share will be up to a 50% match, with the exception of plant food expenses that will be reimbursed up to 25%. Payments will be made after expenses have occurred.
